A strange and beautiful man had dropped to his knees in front of me, unencumbered, unembarrassed. I stopped short. He was slender, almost Asiatic looking, wearing baggy combat trousers and a T-shirt. Forever Changes Jan 03 2020 Widely hailed as a genius, Arthur Lee was a character every bit as colorful and unique as his music.
