Sexuality and Public Space in India is a careful interrogation of the mass-mediatized space of contemporary public discourse around sexuality. Studies.

Written by a Nair, *Indulekha* is

not a grandiose outpouring but

the author's effort to achieve

certain social goals: firstly, to

create a novel much like those

of the English authors he had

read, and secondly, to illustrate

Nair society at that time, both

of which met with success. The

novel influenced the

deliberations of the Malabar

Marriage Commission which it

predated, and of which

Chandum enon was a member.

This novel will appeal to

general readers interested in

Indian writings in translation.
